
Accommodation: Parliament hotel Reykjavik down town

Nowhere but in Iceland will you find vehicles like those we use for our travels today. Crafted for uniquely tough conditions, even a term to describe them had to be invented. “Super Trucks” is the result of decades of insular technical innovation and evolution, from tinkering with old army Jeeps to get further up hill, to our hand-built monsters equally at home crossing Antarctica, the wild Icelandic Highlands – or the highway. These jeeps are capable of navigating the steepest and rockiest of terrains, deserts or beaches.

Each vehicle is custom built with up to three separate transmissions, two separate steering systems, fully in-cab adjustable four corner air suspension, fully lockable differentials, up to 7.3 liter turbocharged engines, an array of radio equipment, marine-type satellite navigation... Oh, and the biggest available legal road tires in the world. Mercedes Bens Sprinter: Highly capable super truck with individual seats for your comfort.

Day 2: Superjeeps in highlands of Iceland



We only recommend Experienced drivers who are confident in handling large vehicles on very rough terrain, who navigates the rough highland roads and unbridged glacial rivers to take you to remote wilderness areas like Langjökull. By "rough" we mean driving on surfaces that look like the moon and crossing rivers without bridges. A great opportunity to experience untouched nature and volcanic eruption sites. Thankfully our super-jeep tour operators have well-equipped, well-maintained vehicles, rigorous safety protocols and years of experience driving in Iceland's extreme conditions.

Day 2: Snowmobile on a glacier

Enjoy a private tour to Langjökull glacier. After short instruction of how to drive and safeties you will join an exhilarating one-hour guided snowmobiling tour across the endless white snowfields, a great way to combine the adrenaline-filled activity of your choice with the awe-inspiring scenery. All gear for the ride will be hand out by the Snowmobile base: special overall, gloves, balaclava and helmet. Day 2 : Dinner at Monkeys Restaurant and bar

Monkeys Restaurant

Monkeys is located at Klapparstigur 28-30 in Hjartagarður. You enter a warm, colorful and exciting environment where guests can enjoy exotic food.

The place is a small courses bar with a large selection of exotic dishes influenced by Peru and Japan. There is a strong emphasis on a good selection of wines by the glass, especially sparkling wines from all over the world, as well as great cocktails.

Nikkei cooking is the name of the cuisine that dominates the food here. It has its origins in the second half of the 19th century, when Japanese immigrants began to settle in Peru to a considerable extent. There, centuries-old cooking techniques from Japan were mixed with Peru's varied cuisine. Nikkei cooking combines the best of each cuisine, e.g. respect for the raw material and the composition of exotic flavors. Thus, Japanese dishes were admirably linked to the tastes and cooking methods of the indigenous peoples of Peru. This blend incorporates the best of Japan's elegant and refined food culture, as well as the exquisite fresh ingredients blended with Peruvian spice.

From the back of an Icelandic horse you'll feel closer to nature than you've ever felt before. The Icelandic horse is small, strong and sure-footed, and it carries you comfortably across rough terrain. The colorful breed is characterized by its friendly spirit and many gaits, particularly the special tölt, which can be slow or fast but always super smooth.

Day 3 Option: Lava Cave (Duration 3 hour)


Caving in Iceland is a dark, strange and unique experience. You literally walk into a world that once was glowing hot and bright but now is frozen black. In winter you even have ice stalagmites that can give the adventurer an otherworldly feeling.

Our lava caves are like veins of the volcanoes as molten lava flows through lava fields and forms these tunnels. When the volcano sleeps again it leaves behind empty shells that turn into an exciting underworld of caves for us to explore.

Our caving experience is special as we blend together a caving expedition and folklore, learning about the Elves or hidden people, ghosts, outlaws and other strange creatures of Iceland.

A journey into Raufarhólshellir is a unique experience and a great opportunity to witness the inner workings of a volcanic eruption as one walks in the path of lava that flowed during the Leitahehraun eruption, which occurred east of the Bláfjöll mountains about 5200 years ago. Every winter spectacular ice sculptures are formed inside the entrance of the cave making the experience of visiting the lava tunnel even more breathtaking.

Day 3 Option: Biking (Duration 3 hour)

Introducing “GEO TRAILS,” our incredible e-mountain bike adventure tour. Experience a quality full-suspension e-MTB while exploring the picturesque surroundings near Hveragerði village. This fun and easy day tour is suitable for all active people that love the outdoors. We’ll be covering 10-15km in 1-2 hours, the trip duration depends on your preferred speed and distance.

The trails showcase the Geothermal energy bubbling below our feet plus lava fields, small waterfalls, rivers and steamy mudpools. Riding an e-MTB is a fun way to explore nature and getting a little help with pedalling uphill is a great way to experience this mesmerising landscape. We make frequent stops to take everything in; the views, the silence, the smell. And then we head on, smile on our faces.

Day 3 Option : Snorkeling (Duration 6hrs)

Silfra, the fissure between the continents


About 40 min drive from your hotel in Reykjavik to snorkeling location. The Silfra fissure, is known as one of the top dive sites in the world for two main reasons.

First, the Silfra fissure is actually a crack between the North American and Eurasian continents, meaning that you dive or snorkel right where the continental plates meet and drift apart about 2cm per year.

Silfra is the only place where one can dive or snorkel directly in the crack between two continental plates.

Secondly, the underwater visibility in the Silfra fissure is over 100 meters, which creates an underwater experience that will rarely, if ever, be surpassed. The reasons for this astounding water clarity are twofold: the water is cold ($2^{\circ}\text{C} - 4^{\circ}\text{C}$ year round) as it is glacial water from the nearby Langjökull and this water is filtered through porous underground lava for 30-100 years until it reaches the north end of Thingvellir lake, seeping out from underground wells. The Silfra water is as pristine as water can get and you can drink it at anytime during your dive or snorkel.

Day 3 Option: Whale Watching (Duration 4 hrs)

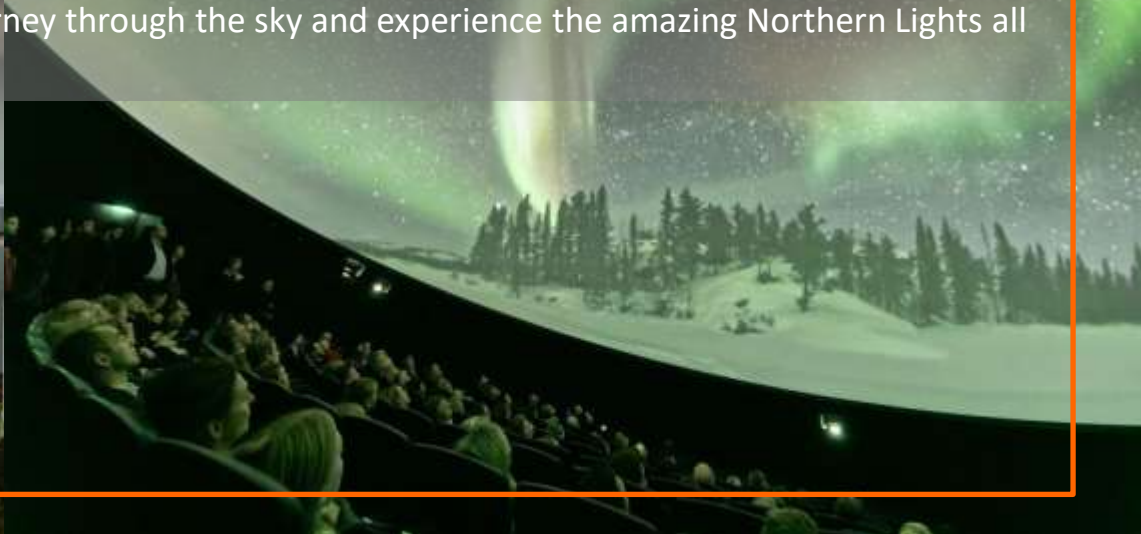
Your whale watching adventure begins at Reykjavik's Old Harbour, just minutes away from the city centre! The friendly guides, along with the captain and crew, point out where to spot the whales and give interesting information about the different kinds of whales and seabirds you can expect to see. (minke whale, dolphins, humpback whale)

Day 3 Option: Wonders of Iceland (Duration 2 hrs)



At Perlan you truly get to know Iceland, an island born of fire and ice. You feel the forces of nature and learn how Iceland was formed. Explore seabirds in a lifelike cliff and go on a cinematic underwater journey around Iceland.

You explore the world's first real indoor ice cave and learn all about glaciers at an interactive exhibition. The Icelandic Museum of Natural History also has an interactive and engaging exhibition at Perlan. There, you discover the mysteries of water in Icelandic nature; its unique features, life, and qualities. Finally, sit back in a first-class Planetarium to go on a virtual journey through the sky and experience the amazing Northern Lights all year around.



Day 3 Option: Helicopterflight

Indulge in a bird's eye view of Iceland's nature.

On this tour, your pilot chooses your scenic adventure! Experience views of majestic Iceland as you fly over rugged mountain terrain and lava fields you may even be standing on a glacier. Don't forget your camera as these views are not to be missed.

Take off will be decided by the pilot the day before the trip. As often, it is the weather that controls our plans here in Iceland. Flights, landings, and routes may vary due to weather and at the pilot's discretion.

Day 3 Option: National Museum



Explore the heritage and history of Iceland from the thrilling Viking era to modern times with this entry ticket for the National Museum of Iceland in Reykjavík.


The museum's permanent exhibition offers a unique insight into the history of the Icelandic nation from the Settlement to the present day, guided by the question: What makes a nation?

It is conceived as a journey through time: it begins with the ship in which medieval settlers crossed the ocean to their new home, it ends in a modern airport, the Icelanders' gateway to the world.

The exhibition includes about 2000 artifacts, dating from the Settlement Age to the present, as well as photographs from the 20th century.

You'll see the famous figure of Thor, dated from the year 1000, the first bible printed in Iceland in the 16th century, still considered one of the most beautiful prints in Icelandic and beautiful artifacts from mediaeval churches - among other fascinating artifacts.

Day 3 Option: Sea Fishing/Angling



We set off from Reykjavik's Old Harbour and head out to Faxaflói Bay, where our experienced fishermen will usually spot fish in a flash! If you haven't been sea fishing before, don't worry, it's very easy, and the crew will happily show you the ropes, advising you on bait and passing on their knowledge of the seas. On our sea angling trips you have a good chance of catching cod, halibut, haddock, rockfish and pollock. The sea angling tours are perfectly suited both to experienced fishermen and to those who simply wish to relax and enjoy the beautiful surrounding with a fishing rod in hand. Barbecuing the fish caught is indeed available and a popular option for the proud fishermen! Light BBQ on board catch.

Höfnin is a cozy restaurant located in an fishermen's hut on the harbor front in Reykjavík, with a great view over the gently rocking boats in the harbor and mount Esja in the distance.

Day 3: Dinner at Viking Village Restaurant

DINNER AT VIKING VILLAGE

At the Viking Village restaurant true Viking feast is offered with traditional meals served in old fashioned Viking-style trays. We strongly recommend the Viking feast dinner served with one schnapps of Black Death and one beer. Waiters and waitresses dressed in authentic Viking clothing and serve meals with flair. During these famous feasts there is not a dull moment and the guests can expect various treats and surprises offered by our singing Valkyries and Vikings. The fun reaches its height when the Head-Viking crowns one guest as an Honorary Viking.

Day 4: Thorsmork Valley adventure in Super Truck

The day starts by driving in a super jeep/SUV. **Thorsmork** is one of the shiniest pearls in the string of beautiful areas of the country, surrounded by rugged and beautiful mountains, glaciers and glacial rivers, decorated with small birch woods and silver lined with humming brooks. Many have attempted to describe the charm of this area. Icelanders appreciate Thorsmork and visit it frequently the whole year round. Quite a few brooks and rivers have to be forced to get there and no-one should attempt the trip without the company of experienced guide since the glacial rivers are very unpredictable.

Thorsmork has often been difficult to reach, except by mountain vehicles. There are a multitude of small gullies and valleys, clad with low birch-trees that create seemingly endless possibilities for the nature lover. You will find more than 170 species of plants, moss and lichen in this lush area, which was a fjord some 12,000 years ago.

The outlet **glaciers** tumble and crawl down into the gullies, some of them ending in spectacular glacial lagoons. The glacial melt-off forms rivers that have to be crossed on the way to Thorsmork. Some days the crossing is quite challenging.

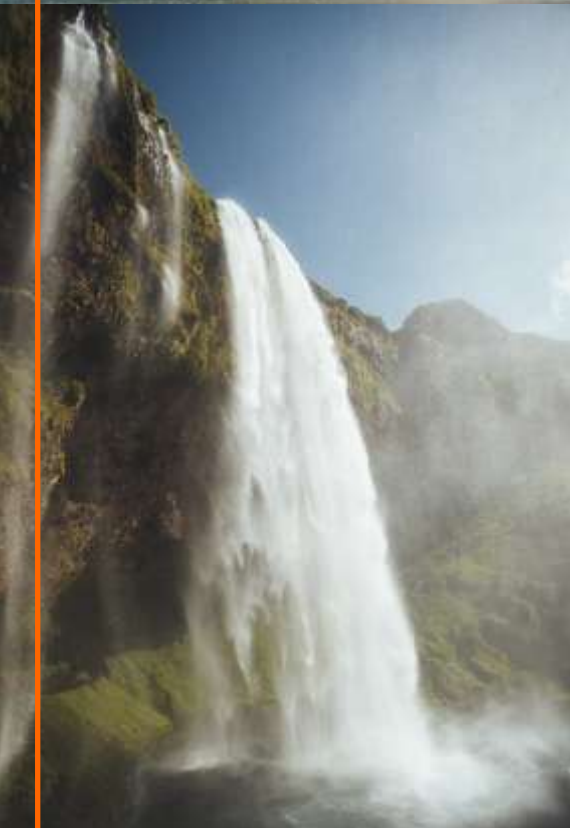
An innocent stream can change in a matter of hours into a thunderous torrent. Our skilled drivers are very experienced in these driving conditions and will take you safely across any river.

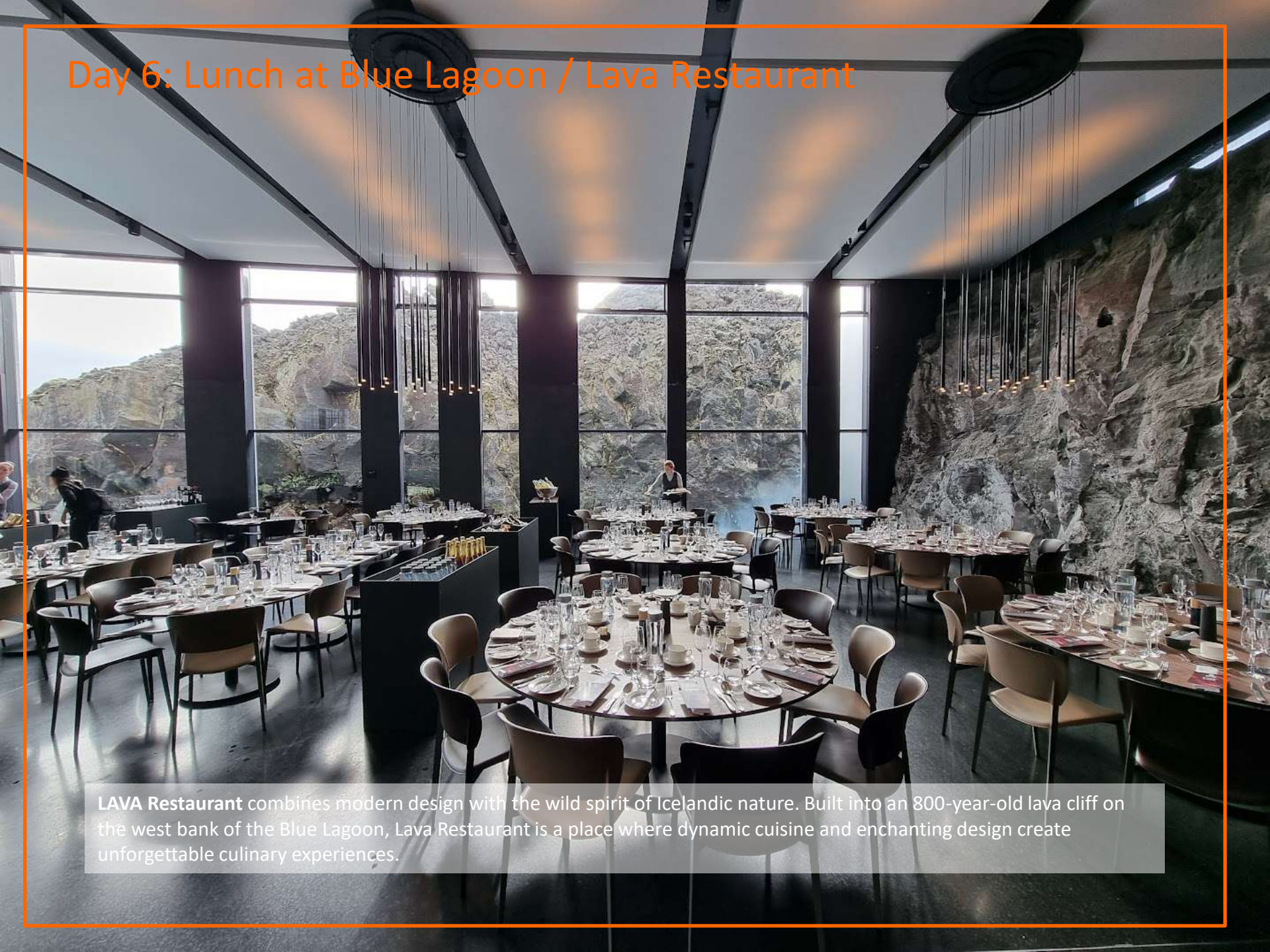
GRILLMARKAÐURINN RESTAURANT IN REYKJAVIK

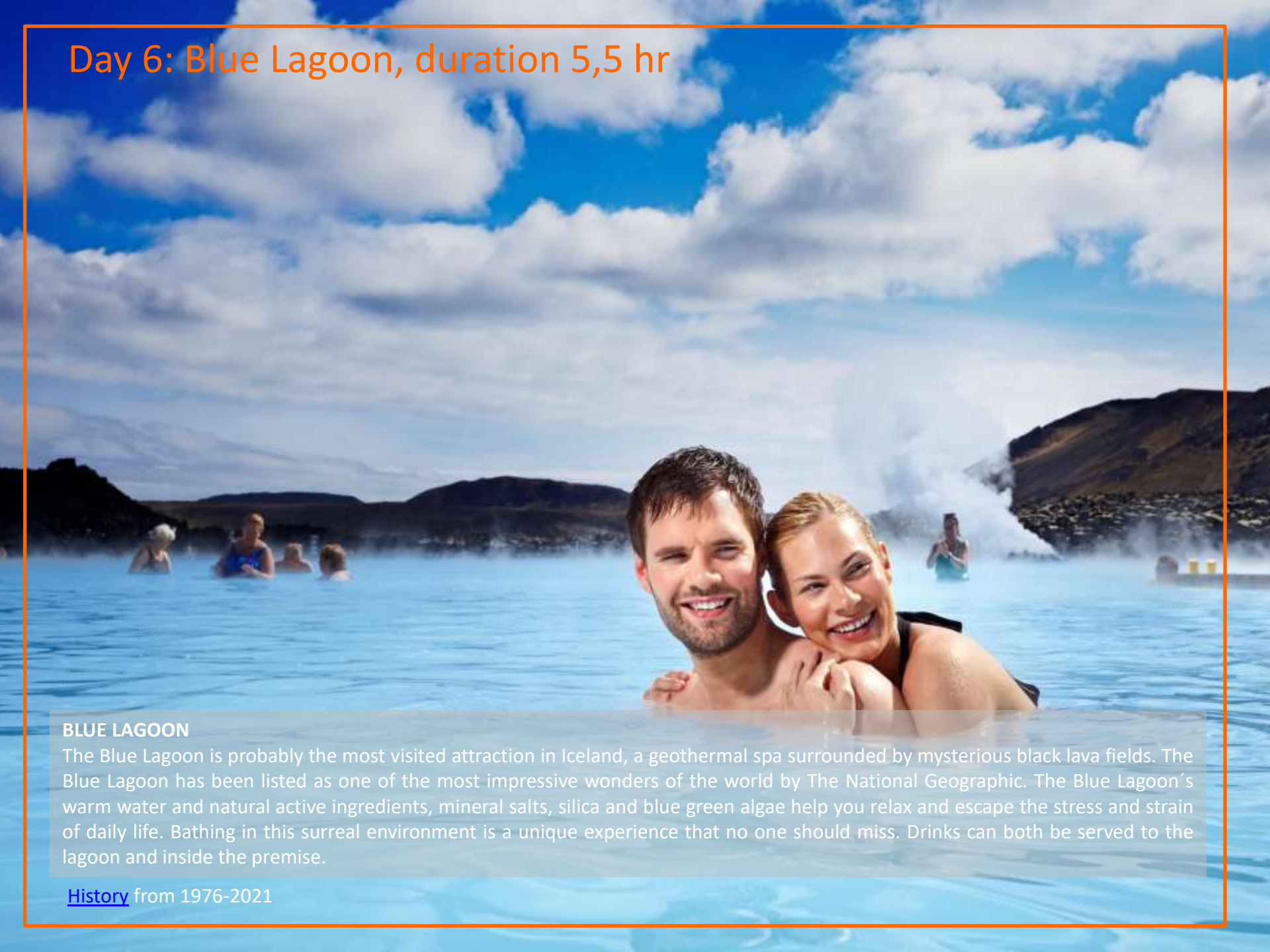



PRACTICAL INFORMATION

Banks are open from 09:15 to 16:00. As general rule offices are open from 09:00 to 17:00, in some cases during the summer these hours are from 08:00 to 16:00. Shops are open from 09:00 to 18:00 on weekdays. Credit cards are accepted by most shops, restaurants and organizations and are widely used. The major credit cards in Iceland are Visa and Master Card, although other cards are accepted as well in some places. Tax-free shopping/tax refund. A refund of the local Value Added Tax is available to visitors to Iceland. The refund will result in a reduction of up to 15% of the retail price, provided departure from Iceland is within 30 days after the purchase is made. The purchased amount must be no less than ISK 6.000,- ([VAT included](#)) per sales receipt, and all goods (except woolens) must be packed in sealed bags or containers.

The Icelandic climate is warmer than the name suggests, thanks to the Gulf Stream. Summers in Iceland are rather cool, while the winters are relatively warm. The average monthly summer temperature ranges from 10 to 13 °C. During the summer the climate is mild but unstable with possible rain and frequent weather changes. The daily temperature can fluctuate from a minimum 5 °C at night to a maximum of 25 °C during the day.

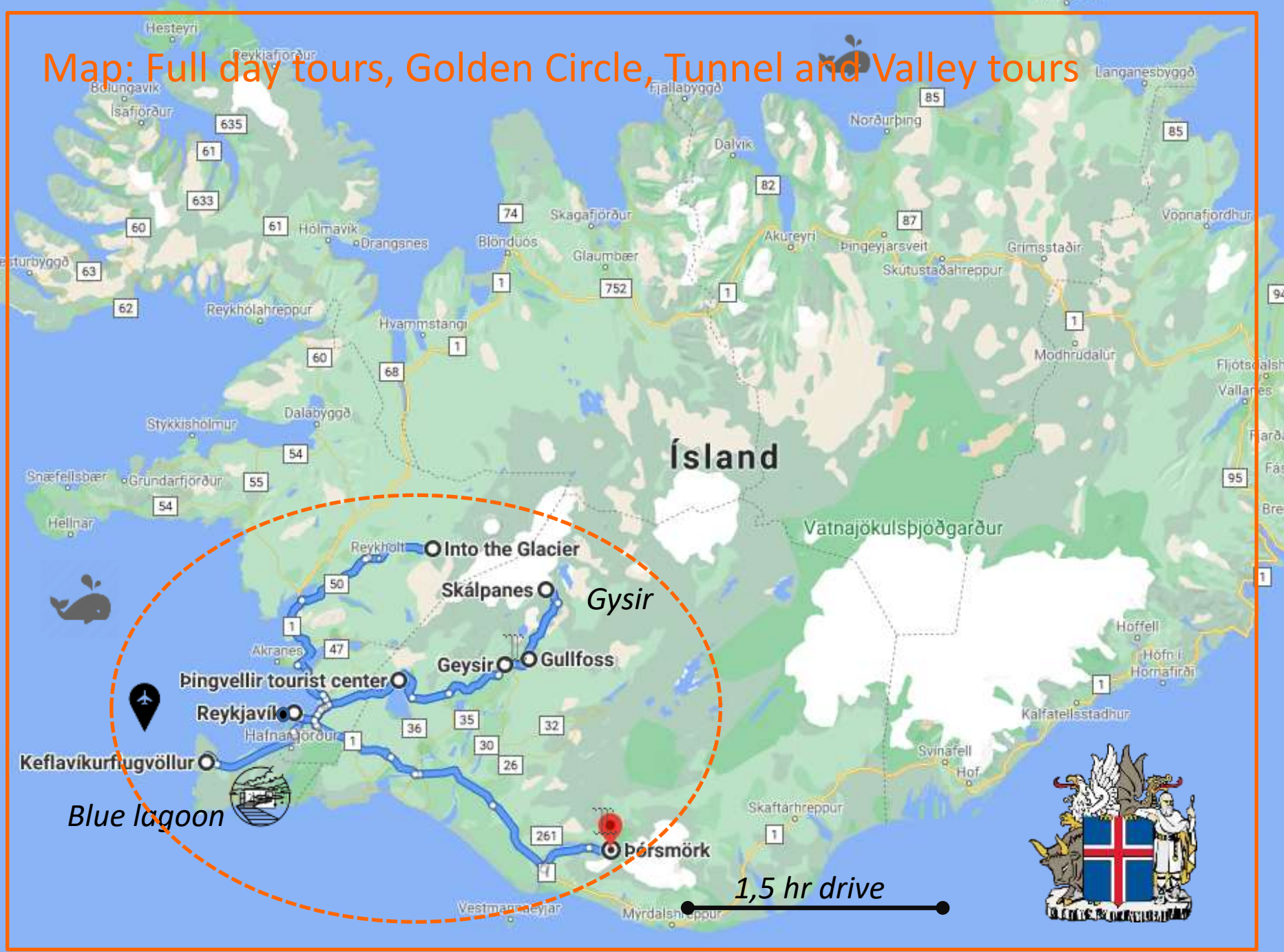

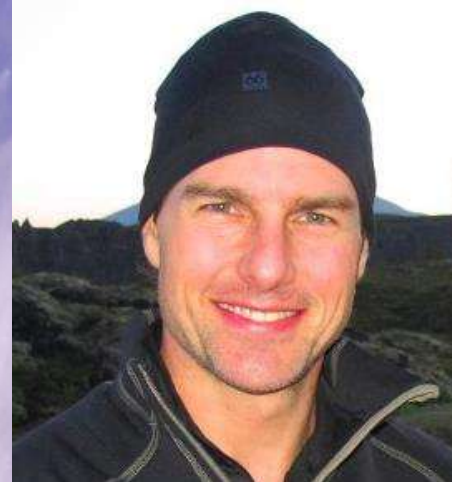

Located on Hengill volcano in the South of Iceland, Hellisheidarvirkjun (or Hellisheidi) heat and power plant (CHP) constitutes the largest power station of Iceland and the second largest geothermal power station in the world. The geothermal power plant was created to provide electricity to the city of Reykjavik as there is an increasing demand. Only 11 km separate the Hellisheidarvirkjun geothermal plant from Nesjavellir which is the second largest geothermal power in Iceland.

In Geothermal Exhibition you experience first-hand how green, sustainable energy is produced at one of the largest single-site geothermal power plant on the planet, Hellisheiði ON Power plant. Located in a stunning setting surrounded by lava and moss.
